FEEDING

FEED IN ONE PLACE & KEEP THE FEEDING AREA CLEAN.

REMOVE ANY UNEATEN FOOD WITHIN 30 MINUTES.

LEAVING FOOD OUT 24/7 CAN ATTRACT UNWANTED INSECTS AND WILDLIFE.

ALWAYS PROVIDE FRESH FOOD AND WATER, EVEN DURING THE COLDER MONTHS.
